Immigrant population

Immigrants make up an important part of local communities in Anne Arundel County and Maryland. Nonetheless, no noncitizen is exempt from the risk of deportation, which threatens the stability and family unity of immigrants and U.S.-born people alike.

Anne Arundel County



60,800 immigrants reside in Anne Arundel County, or **10 percent** of Anne Arundel County's population.

Maryland



1 million immigrants reside in Maryland, or **17 percent** of the total population.

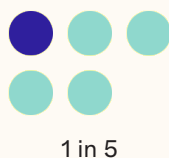

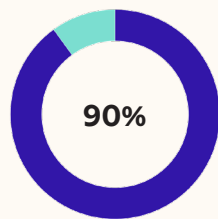

The **vast majority of children** in Anne Arundel County with at least one immigrant parent (**90 percent**) were born in the United States.

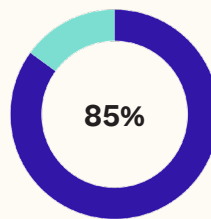
Maryland

There are **435,300** children in Maryland with at least one **immigrant parent**.



One in three children in Maryland has at least one **immigrant parent**.



The **vast majority of children** in Maryland with at least one immigrant parent (**85 percent**) were born in the United States.

Local community ties



52,200 immigrants residing in Anne Arundel County have lived in the United States **for 10 years or more**.



At least **25,300** homes in Anne Arundel County are **owned by immigrants**.



3,100 immigrants in Anne Arundel County are **entrepreneurs**.



7,800 immigrants in Anne Arundel County are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

Immigrants in the economy

Immigrants in Anne_Arundel_County, Maryland, and the United States are indispensable members of the workforce and contribute to the economy by paying federal, state, and local taxes.

Tax contributions*

Maryland

\$55.3B Immigrant-led households **earned \$55.3 billion**.

\$5.9B Immigrants contributed **\$5.9 billion** in combined **state and local taxes**.

\$9.9B Immigrants contributed **\$9.9 billion** in **federal taxes**.

\$39.5B This means that immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$39.5 billion** in **spending power**.

United States

\$2.35T Immigrant-led households **earned \$2.35 trillion**.

\$232.1B Immigrants contributed **\$232.1 billion** in combined **state and local taxes**.

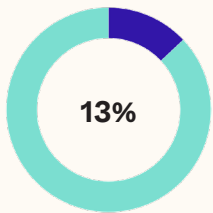
\$419.8B Immigrants contributed **\$419.8 billion** in **federal taxes**.

\$1.7T This means that immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$1.7 trillion** in **spending power**.

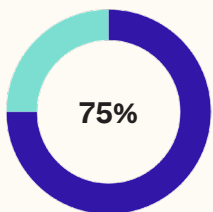

Anne Arundel County

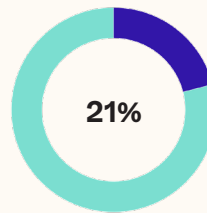


43,700 immigrant workers make up **13 percent** of the county's labor force.

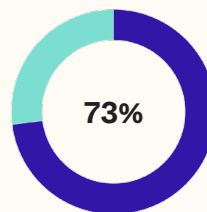


75 percent of the county's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the county's U.S.-born population (69 percent).

Maryland



714,000 immigrant workers make up **21 percent** of the state's labor force.



73 percent of immigrants **participate in the state's labor force**, greater than the share among the U.S.-born population (66 percent).
