# Immigrant population

Immigrants make up an important part of local communities in Clark County and Nevada. Nonetheless, no noncitizen is exempt from the risk of deportation, which threatens the stability and family unity of immigrants and U.S.-born people alike.

### **Clark County**



**497,900 immigrants** reside in **Clark County**, or **22 percent** of Clark County's population.

#### Nevada



**613,800 immigrants** reside in **Nevada**, or **19 percent** of the total population.

**229,400 noncitizens** are living in **Clark County**.

190.3K children There are **190,300** children in Clark County with at least one **immigrant parent**.

There are **236,400** children in Nevada with at least one **immigrant parent.**

Two in five children in Clark County have at least one immigrant parent.



Three in eight children in Nevada have at least one immigrant parent.



The vast majority of children in Clark County with at least one immigrant parent (90 percent) were born in the United States.

The vast majority of children in Nevada with at least one immigrant parent (93 percent) were born in the United States.

### Local community ties



**384,400** immigrants residing in Clark County have lived in the United States since **2009** or earlier.



**20,800** immigrants in Clark County are **entrepreneurs**.



At least **123,600** homes in Clark County are **owned by immigrants**.



**39,400** immigrants in Clark County are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

# Immigrants in the economy

Immigrants in Nevada and the United States are indispensable members of the workforce and contribute to the economy by paying federal, state, and local taxes.

### Tax contributions\*

### Nevada

### \$25B Immigrant-led households earned \$25 billion.

### \$1.8B Immigrants contributed \$1.8 billion in combined state and local taxes.

This means immigrant-led households \$19.1B have an estimated \$19.1 billion in spending power.

### United States

Immigrant-led households earned \$2.4

\$232.1B Immigrants contributed \$232.1 billion in combined state and local taxes.

Immigrants contributed \$419.8 billion in \$419.8B federal taxes.


This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$1.7 trillion in spending power.

## Employment and labor force participation

#### Clark County Nevada



315,700 immigrant workers make up 27 percent of the county's labor force.



387,000 immigrant workers make up 24 percent of the state's labor force.



65 percent of the county's immigrants participate in the labor force, greater than the share among the county's U.S.-born population (63 percent).



65 percent of immigrants participate in the state's labor force, greater than the share among the state-born population (63 percent).
