
Profile of immigrants in Madison, Wisconsin

12,100 immigrants in the Madison metro area are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.


Immigrants in the economy

Immigrants in Wisconsin and the United States are indispensable members of the workforce and contribute to the economy by paying federal, state, and local taxes.
