# Immigrant population

Immigrants make up an important part of local communities in Montgomery County and Maryland. Nonetheless, no noncitizen is exempt from the risk of deportation, which threatens the stability and family unity of immigrants and U.S.-born people alike.

### **Montgomery County**



**352,800 immigrants** reside in **Montgomery County**, or **33 percent** of Montgomery County's population.

1.1 million immigrants reside in



**246,700** immigrants residing in Montgomery County have lived in the United States **since 2009** or earlier.



At least **91,100** homes in Montgomery County are **owned by immigrants**.



**18,700** immigrants in Montgomery County are **entrepreneurs**.



**47,500** immigrants in Montgomery County are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

# Immigrants in the economy

Immigrants in Maryland and the United States are indispensable members of the workforce and contribute to the economy by paying federal, state, and local taxes.

## Tax contributions\*

### Maryland

\$55.3B Immigrant-led households earned \$55.3 billion.

**\$5.9B** Immigrants contributed **\$5.9 billion** in combined **state and local taxes**.

\$9.9B Immigrants contributed \$9.9 billion in federal taxes.

\$39.5B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$39.5 billion in spending power.

#### **United States**

\$2.4T Immigrant-led households earned \$2.4 trillion.


\$232.1B Immigrants contributed \$232.1 billion in combined state and local taxes.

\$419.8B Immigrants contributed \$419.8 billion in federal taxes.

\$1.7T This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$1.7 trillion in spending power.

# Employment and labor force participation

# **Montgomery County**



**241,200** immigrant workers make up **41 percent** of the county's labor force.




**73 percent** of the county's immigrants participate in the labor force, greater than the share among the county's U.S.-born population (68 percent).

## Maryland



**729,100** immigrant workers make up **22 percent** of the state's labor force.



**74 percent** of immigrants **participate in the state's labor force**, greater than the share among the state-born population (66 percent).
