# Immigrant population

The foreign-born population in Austin and Texas represent an important and diverse share of their local communities, many of whom live in mixed-status families.

#### **Austin Metro Area**



339,700 immigrants reside in Austin, or 15 percent of the total population.

### **Texas**



4.9 million immigrants reside in Texas, or 17 percent of the total population.

# Population at risk of deportation

205K 205,100 non-citizens residing in Austin are potentially at risk of deportation.

3 million non-citizens residing in Texas are potentially at risk of deportation.

### **Austin Metro Area**

164K children There are 164,400 children in Austin with at least one immigrant parent.

**Texas** 

2.4M children There are 2.4 million children in Texas with at least one immigrant parent.

The vast majority of children with at least one immigrant parent in Texas are U.S. citizens. 87 percent were born in the United States.

### Local community ties



237,400 immigrants have lived in the Austin metro area since 2009 or earlier.



At least 81,100 homes in the Austin metro area are owned by immigrants.



30,300 immigrants in the Austin metro area are entrepreneurs.



44,500 immigrants in the Austin metro area are students enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

# Economic and labor force contributions

Immigrants in Austin and Texas contribute critical tax dollars to the local economy and are indispensable members of the workforce.

### **Austin Metro Area**

\$13.8B Immigrant-led households earned \$13.8 billion.

\$1.1B Immigrants contributed \$1.1 billion in combined state and local taxes.

\$2.6B Immigrants contributed \$2.6 billion in federal taxes.

\$10.2B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$10.2 billion in spending power.

### **Texas**

\$161B Immigrant-led households earned \$161 billion.


\$13.1B Immigrants contributed \$13.1 billion in combined state and local taxes.

\$25.3B Immigrants contributed \$25.3 billion in federal taxes.

\$122.6B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$122.6 billion in spending power.

## Labor force participation

### **Austin Metro Area**



**235,100** immigrant workers comprise **19 percent** of the labor force.



**73** percent of immigrants participate in the labor force, comparable to the share among the native-born population (71 percent).

#### **Texas**



**3.1 million** immigrant workers comprise **22 percent** of the state's labor force.



**67 percent** of the state's immigrants participate in the labor force, comparable to the share among the state's native-born population (65 percent).
