Madison Metro Area



51,000 immigrants reside in **Madison**, or **8 percent** of the total population.

Wisconsin



295,100 immigrants reside in **Wisconsin**, or **5 percent** of the total population.



Local community ties



31,400 immigrants have lived in the Madison metro area **since 2009 or earlier**.



At least **9,700** homes in the Madison metro area are **owned by immigrants**.



1,900 immigrants in the Madison metro area are **entrepreneurs**.



12,000 immigrants in the Madison metro area are **students** enrolled in pre-K through college or graduate school.

Economic and labor force contributions

Immigrants in Madison and Wisconsin contribute critical tax dollars to the local economy and are indispensable members of the workforce.

Madison Metro Area

\$1.8B Immigrant-led households earned \$1.8 billion.

\$173.3M Immigrants contributed \$173.3 million in combined state and local taxes.

\$324.3M Immigrants contributed \$324.3 million in federal taxes.

\$1.3B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated \$1.3 billion in spending power.

Wisconsin

\$9.8B Immigrant-led households earned \$9.8 billion.

\$963.9M Immigrants contributed \$963.9 million in combined state and local taxes.

\$1.5B Immigrants contributed \$1.5 billion in federal taxes.

\$7.3B This means immigrant-led households have an estimated **\$7.3 billion** in **spending power**.

Labor force participation

Madison Metro Area



34,200 immigrant workers comprise **9 percent** of the labor force.



72 percent of immigrants **participate in the labor force**, comparable to the share among the native-born population (71 percent).

Wisconsin



192,400 immigrant workers comprise **6 percent** of the state's labor force.



69 percent of the state's immigrants **participate in the labor force**, greater than the share among the state's native-born population (66 percent).
